## About Sugar Creek Bluff State Natural Area

Sugar Creek Bluff State Natural Area, a 440acre bluffland preserve, is in Crawford County near the Mississippi River.

The first part of Sugar Creek Bluff was purchased by Mississippi Valley Conservancy in 1999 to permanently protect the habitat from future development. It is open to hunting, fishing, hiking, bird watching and nature enjoyment. Since that time, MVC has more than doubled the size of the preserve through a series of acquisitions of adjacent parcels.

With the help of countless volunteers over the years, MVC has conducted extensive restoration of the prairie on top of the bluff. MVC's first prescribed burn took place here in 2006.

Please note that part of the land is located within the Village of Ferryville and part is in the Town of Freeman. Hunters must acquaint themselves with the location of municipal boundaries and applicable regulations. Visit www.ferryville.com for more information.


